One of the ways we live with honourable purpose is through our support of local, national and international charitable causes. We do this as individuals, form classes and as a school at different times of year.

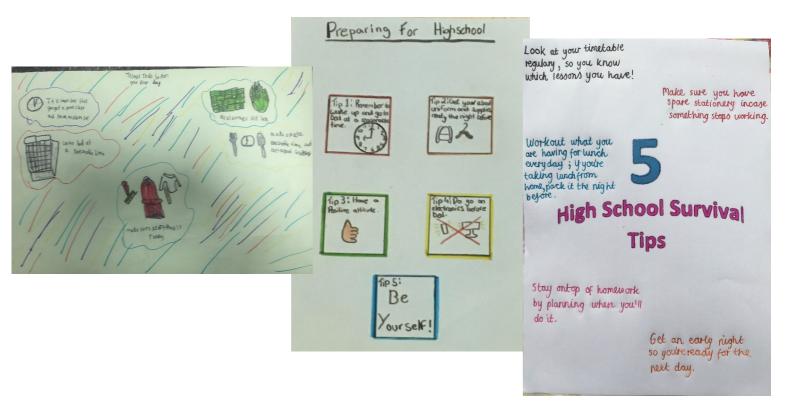
